- **A shared global language** – How can ISO 25553 help planners, developers, and policymakers embed best practice internationally?

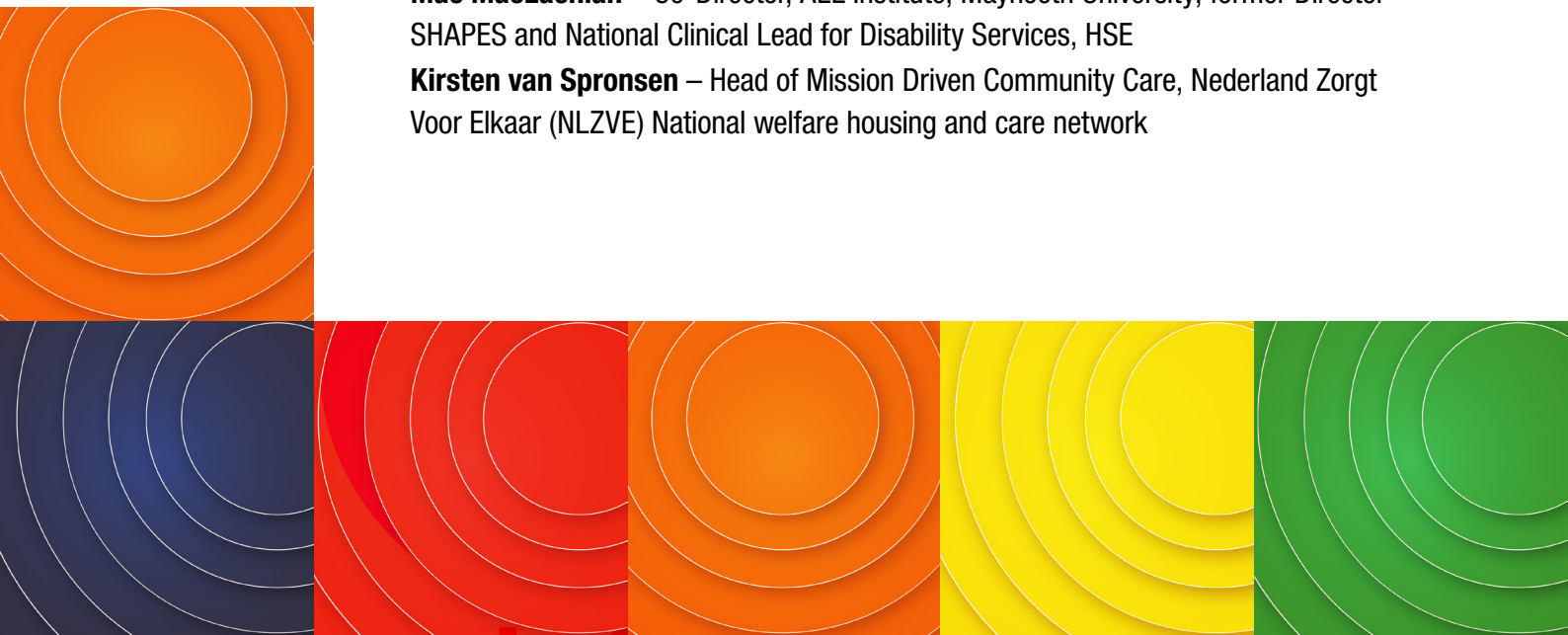

DECENTRALISING HEALTH AND CARE

Designing for Access, Autonomy, and Wellbeing

With health systems under increasing strain, decentralised, community-based care is no longer aspirational – it's essential. Around the world, countries grappling with “super-ageing” are embedding care into the fabric of everyday life, rethinking how homes, neighbourhoods, and digital infrastructure can support wellbeing, independence, and prevention.

To set the scene, **Lynne Douglas**, CEO of Bield Housing and Care and recent Churchill Fellow, will share insights drawn from her research in Japan, Hong Kong, Australia, and New Zealand – offering a timely perspective on how other societies are designing for longevity.
